The Valencian rivers, those that have all their sections in the Valencian Community, are of short lengths and with average high slopes, due mainly to the rugged relief that they have to cross, crossing a variety of landscapes among which the fluvial ones themselves (canyons, plains, river terraces) and those of their immediate surroundings. In addition, in the riverbeds a varied activity has been carrying out that goes from the construction of reservoirs to the use of its waters for diverse supplies, among which include the irrigation.

El Magro, tributary of the Júcar, is a typical example of this type of Valencian Mediterranean river. Of approximately 130 km in length, it crosses different topographical environments from its source in the Sierra de Mira, passing through the flat plain of Utiel-Requena, to later cross the Sierra de Martés, finally opening to an increasingly wide plain in the surroundings of Turis.

The proposed itinerary, of low difficulty and approximately 11 km of route, focuses on the landscape characteristics of the Magro in its central part (in the Sierra de Martés). In this area, the characteristics of the river are combined, such as its tortuous evolution when crossing the mountainous system, with the landscapes of its mountainous surroundings and the interventions made in it to take advantage of its waters (the Forata reservoir and the Magro river channel).
